

## 2023 Objectives

- Continue structural improvements to the second floor, including converting the former Computer
  Lab to a new multi-use programming room and the former Reference Office into an additional
  study room, and incorporating new display spaces for popular circulating materials.
- 2. Strengthen teen services by upgrading the furniture to make more effective use of the new Teen Lounge, incorporating a quiet study area into the Teen Collections Room, and improving training on library services to young adults for part-time staff.
- 3. Pursue fundraising options for the Children's Room modernization project, to include new paint, carpet, and furniture.
- 4. Strengthen relationship with local homeschooling families and groups. Develop needs assessments and implement programming to support their educational goals.
- 5. Evaluate usage of various sub-collections, particularly Children's nonfiction and the Maine Collection, and implement various strategies to improve patron awareness and access to these.
- 6. Develop a plan to improve organization, storage, and access to the Lewiston Collection and other archival materials.
- 7. Work with Lewiston Public Schools to develop a plan to provide greater access to materials for both educators and students.
- 8. Finalize RFID service improvements, including the introduction of a self-check station and developing a comprehensive process for adding and removing RFID-tagged materials.
